Understanding Your Lyric Only Judging Report

Thank you for participating in the 21st Annual NSAI Song Contest presented by Martin Guitars and Strings and CMT! Your song has been judged based on the following 10 questions dealing with composition, originality, and lyrics. Each question was given a rating between 1 (low) and 10 (high). A song could receive low scores in some elements and still be considered an overall strong song by the judge. Remember, this evaluation is meant ONLY as a tool to help you discern the strength of your song/songwriting in the eyes of the judge, as music is subjective.

This report does not in any way indicate final standing in the contest. The Top 20 highest scored entries advanced to the next round of judging. Potential finalists were notified via email and/or phone in January 2021. The Lyric-Only Category Winner and Runner-Up were determined during the third stage of judging and was announced during the final judging for the Song Category Final Judging. 7	Is there a strong lyrical beginning that captures your attention?
8	Does the writer approach the idea in a unique and fresh way?
7	Are the lyrics descriptive and clear, building on the theme of the song?
8	Is there a fresh use of language, imagery and/or rhyme?
8	Is there appropriate use of contrast and/or repetition within both the verse/A Section and the chorus/B Section.
8	Are line length and stress/syllable count consistent from section to section?
8	Is there a memorable lyrical hook?
7	Is the song format (length, structure, etc) appropriate?
7	Does the song evoke an emotional response from you as the reader?
8	Does the combination of all sections make for a good overall flow?
