Comments

Despite the cleverness of the title/hook phrase, most folks won't be enthused about "the singers" useless boat. Keep in mind that most audiences (as well as song publishers) want to be inspired and entertained. In the case of this theme, his overwhelming antipathy and numb demeanor as it relates to his boat isn't likely to create the needed impression for a long lasting and robust lyrical theme.

Definitions

Number Ratings: Judges rate the components of each song on a scale from 1 to 10. A rating of '1' suggests a need for major improvement, '5' is average and a rating of '10' signifies excellence.

Title/Hook: Is the title memorable and interesting? Does the lyric contain a distinct and engaging chorus, refrain and/or centralized hook?

Clarity/Theme Development: Is the meaning of the lyric effectively communicated? Is the central theme focused and developed?

Imagery: Does the lyric contain vivid images and/or memorable phrases?

Rhyming: Is there a consistent rhyming pattern? Are rhymes fresh and engaging?

Structure: Is there a cohesive lyrical structure? Are the structural components (verse, chorus, bridge) effectively designed?

Adaptability: Can these lyrics be successfully adapted to music?

Originality: Is the overall lyric distinctive and communicated in a fresh way?
